COMMANDER'S ASSESSMENT

An activity filled week for the V Corps Artillery (Prov), HHB VCA continues to prepare soldiers for deployment forward, ensure RD personnel remain deployable, and provide Command and Control for R & R Leave soldiers. The last group of R and R

soldiers for VCA is occurring this week. Having sent seven personnel to theater on the End-of Month ULN flight, we anticipate only one remaining soldier to send down on the EOM ULN Flight. This week on the 10th and 12th, the 90 Day Command Inspection for the HHB Commander was executed, with inspections occurring in Eight Key Commodity areas, out brief to the Commander and First Sergeant is on Monday. We are in the execution portion of Holiday Safety Campaign, focusing this week on soldier and spouse suicide awareness, and Holiday Stress prior to the half-day schedule. We continue to execute Winter Safety Campaign, making available both Winter Safety and Driving Safety tape to soldiers and spouses, incorporating these also into Seven day stand down schedule for redeploying personnel. Copies of both tapes and V Corps Safety Office training materials were transported to our deployed soldiers via ULN flight, IOT incorporate training into redeployment preparation. We are currently over 90% on Influenza shots for the rear detachment. CFC is 99% contacted and 70% contributed; qualifying for a "Gold". The nine personnel from V Corps Artillery in PLDC passed the Land Nav, and are doing well, unit visits occurred last week. VCA remains in compliance with current IAVA requirements. VCA Remains in compliance with specified tasks Holiday and Winter Safety Campaign VCA Planning staff continues participation in V Corps planning efforts for Redeployment.

FUTURE ACTIVITIES

Next week is focused on safety preparation for the Holiday Schedule, and placing as many RD soldiers on Block Leave as possible, as they will not participate in the unit block leave upon it's return. We maintain vigilance in our Command Maintenance, Small Arms Qualification (the last range for the year occurring on the 16th of December, planned to bring us to over 95% qualification), Holiday Safety, and Winter Safety Campaigns. 411th BSB maintains C2 of Force Protection taskings, as we transition from Bundeswehr support. The VCA will support Guard Mount for Tompkins Barracks, with select personnel beginning the 15th of DEC. Planning and/or execution continues for Winter Safety Campaign, Deployment Support Cycle (DSC and redeployment), R and R Leave C2, and upcoming FRG events. Priority for planning is the Redeployment effort.

COLA TRACKER

HHB VCA has completed the COLA adjustment for all spouses who departed the European Theater. We have had all spouses return back to the theater and have since adjusted the COLA rate back to its original status. No spouses currently will exceed 30 days on their Holiday Vacation plans to CONUS.
