SUBJECT: Enclosure 19 (Personnel Recovery) to V Corps Command Training Guidance for FY 05-06

1. Personnel Recovery .

a. PER HQDA Ltr 525-03-1, all US Army units will adhere to Army and DOD PR Policies and include PR scenario training exercises. Include individual SERE sustainment training in unit annual training. All military, DA civilians and DA contractors (pursuant to the terms of the contract) will meet combatant commander's theater PR admission requirements. SERE training will focus on preparing our personnel to survive isolation in a hostile environment, including captivity, and to return home safely with honor. Identified DA civilians and DA contractors shall know their personal legal status under the Geneva Conventions. DA civilians and DA contractors hired in Theater/AOR will also complete this training, as appropriate. This training is not in lieu of any anti-terrorism training but works in conjunction with it.

(1). Incorporate individual and RCC PR sustainment and collective training.

(2). Ensure soldiers are trained IAW AR 350-30 and DA civilians and DA contractors are trained IAW guidance published by Army G-1.

b. USAREUR Command Training Guidance FY 04-05, paragraph 2, dated 7 Nov 2003; Deployment readiness also includes the integration of personnel recovery.

c. Code of Conduct (CoC) Survival Evasion Resistance Escape (SERE). Due to moderate risk of capture and or exploitation as demonstrated during Operation Iraqi Freedom all V Corps personnel (air and ground) are currently required to complete CoC SERE Level B training; suspense is NLT 30 SEP 04, per EUCOM and USAREUR directives below.

(1) CDRUSEUCOM Policy Memorandum 01-01 paragraph 3.b (CoC Training Requirements) state; Training for military personnel whose assignments entail moderate risk of capture or exploitation, is either conducted at service schools or available as an exportable medium through the appropriate service POCs. This is the minimum level of CoC in EUCOM. Units have until 30 SEP 04 to train personnel to meet this requirement.

(2) USAREUR Command Training Guidance FY 04-05, paragraph 2, dated 7 Nov 2003; Deployment readiness also includes the integration of personnel recovery. Concentrate on meeting the USEUCOM requirement to train all USAREUR personnel in the Code of Conduct (level B) by 30 September 2004.

(3) R + 180 or 30 SEP 04 (Units that did not deploy to OIF/OEF) is the deadline for completion of CoC Level B training. MSC's should begin planning and preparation for this training using the courseware provided by 7<sup>th</sup> ATC (CoC Level B courseware is on 17 Compact Discs, approximately 13 hours). Each MSC received one copy of this courseware in the spring of 2002. Local reproduction is authorized.

(4) Units will identify and prioritize personnel that require CoC SERE Level C training, and request this training through ATARS.

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d. Units will identify and train personnel in Rescue Coordination Center operations through Personnel Recovery (PR) 101 and PR 301. PR 101 may be conducted through a Mobile Training Team from the Joint Personnel Recovery Agency or by attending the course at Fredericksburg VA. PR 101 is a prerequisite to PR 301. PR 301 is conducted only at Fredericksburg VA.

(1) Each Division, Corps Medical, and Aviation Brigade/Regiment will have at least one PR 301 trained person by 3<sup>rd</sup> QTR FY 05.

(2) Each MSC down to Brigade level will have at least one PR 101 trained person by 3<sup>rd</sup> QTR FY 05.
