team, made up of Soldiers from the division surgeon's office and the 415th Civil Affairs Battalion, choose several provinces to receive the new vehicles.

"We are proud to present these ambulances to you and your community," said Lt. Col. Michael Brumage, division surgeon for the 1st Infantry Division and Task Force Danger, during a dedication ceremony for the vehicles.

After the team members ran the ambulances through a brief vehicle inspection, the line of orange and white vans pulled away, headed for their new homes with lights flashing and sirens singing.
